Dear Friends and Supporters,

In 1998 a group of thirteen women business leaders and community volunteers founded Clothes That Work to help women transitioning from public assistance to employment. In 2003 the mission changed, based on the needs of job seekers in Montgomery County, to include women, men, and independent teens. As of December 31, 2021, CTW has helped over 37,000 individuals remove professional image barriers and build confidence for a more successful career search.

We all have experienced the challenges of the COVID19 pandemic, and it is these challenges that have kept our Board of Trustees, and staff pivoting to ensure we meet the clothing and educational needs of our clients during this unprecedented time. It was during a pivotal moment we discovered what happens when CTW goes offsite to provide services to job seekers. Our Workforce Educational Initiative realized 37.5 percent increase in workshop attendees over the number of participants pre-pandemic. This increase was due to the WEI incorporating virtual programs along with in person workshops. Thinking outside of the box opened our eyes to new possibilities!

At our 2021 Fashioning Futures Luncheon we introduced the theme Accelerate Success. We are very deliberate about the theme, as Clothes That Work leadership is taking a strategic look ahead to exciting future projects to improve access to our services. These changes will help accelerate the success of job seekers throughout the Dayton region, and beyond.

We feel the founders of Clothes That Work, would be pleased with the accomplishments made over the past twenty-three years. Our mission and vision have not changed; we will continue their work to clothe, educate, and empower individuals to prepare them for employment success. How will we do this? By planning for the future, and with the continued generosity and support of our valued donors, we will Accelerate Success of job seekers.





Financial Snapshot

The Clothes That Work Board of Trustees is committed to be watchful stewards of the funds entrusted to us by our generous donors. Here is an overview of our financials for years 2020 and 2021.





Services

Clothing and Coaching Program

Job seekers come to Clothes That Work through a network of community partners to receive one-on-one appointments with a trained volunteer coach. Our coaches help clients select interview appropriate attire and offer guidance on how to make a positive impression.

The challenges of providing one-on-one clothing and coaching services during the COVID-19 pandemic did affect the total number of clients served compared to 2018-2019. We attribute this decrease to the 2020 State and Federal shutdowns, and reduction of public transportation.



From 2020 thru 2021, CTW coaches helped

691 clients

select interview appropriate attire and offered guidance on how to make a positive first impression.



Workforce Education Initiative

Our education program includes a series of classes and workshops designed to equip both job seekers and currently employed with the knowledge and skills that lead to personal growth and employment success. The education program seamlessly adapted to the changes brought on by the pandemic and began to offer classes and workshops virtually.

During 2020 and 2021, **86 workshops were held in-person** and **80 workshops were held virtually**. A virtual asynchronous workshop program was created for incoming high school students entering the workforce and was utilized by more than **450 students** in 2020.

Clothing Donations

Clothes That Work relies on the generous clothing donations of others to provide interview and workplace appropriate attire to our clients. Donations are sorted and used in two areas to support our mission: for our clients, and for resale in the Boutique.



The Boutique, a resale shop with a purpose

Clothing donated to Clothes That Work which is not appropriate for interview or work situations, is sold in our upscale Boutique. One hundred persent of revenue generated from the Boutique funds the primary mission of our organization.

Annual Fundraising Events

Spring Fundraiser, Men At Work

Our annual Men At Work fundraising event was created with the goal to engage the community and local businessmen in the mission of Clothes That Work. For years, CTW served mostly women, but over the past few years male clients make up more than 58% of Clothes That Work clients.

COVID 19 safety and health concerns led the Men At Work fundraising committee to change the format of the event to a virtual fundraiser.
